I. Instructions

Welcome to the next round of federal Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) funding. This application is for bridge, rail, roadway and transit projects for funding in 2021. **Applications are due by Friday, January 13, 2017, 5:00 pm.**

Eligibility:

Only jurisdictions within the Duluth-Superior Metropolitan Interstate Council's official planning area, including state agencies, counties, transit, regional rail authorities, tribal governments and cities with a population over 5,000 are eligible to apply. Cities and townships with a population under 5,000 may submit projects, but will need a sponsor by an eligible jurisdiction.

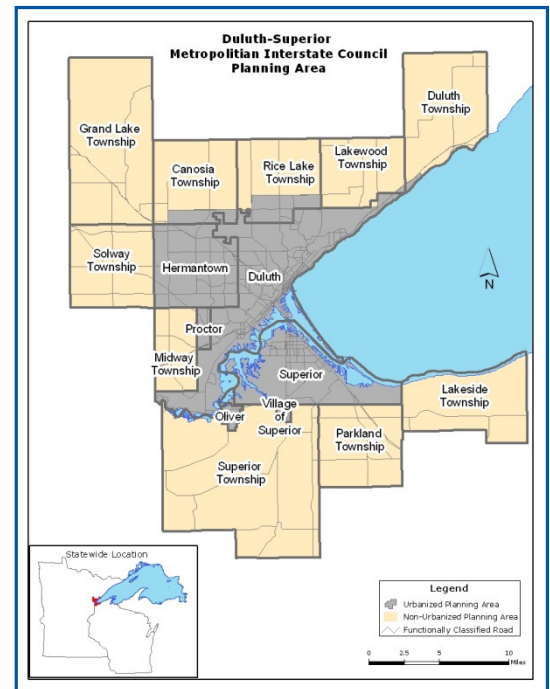
Directions:

- Submit application via e-mail as an attachment
- Include supporting materials such as photos and maps as separate attachments
- No hard copies are necessary

Evaluation Process:

MIC will evaluate each application for consistency with the regional goals, priorities, and project lists in the MIC's Long Range Transportation Plan. The MIC will also hold a public informational meeting to gather public input on each project.

All applications and supporting information will be presented to the Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting in February, where the projects will be individually scored, based on the scoring system approved by the MIC Policy Board in June 2002. The MIC Policy Board will review the applications and the TAC's recommended project rankings at its meeting the next evening. The Policy Board will then decide on the final priority ranking of the projects for submittal into the Northeast Minnesota ATP prioritization process. The ATP process encompasses the entire Arrowhead Region. (For more information see <http://www.nemnntp.org/>).

Prioritization February - March	Jan. 16 – MIC staff begin review of applications. Jan. 23 - Feb. 17 – MIC public involvement activities on proposed projects. Feb. 21/22 – TAC and MIC receive project packets. Mar. 21 – TAC Meeting: projects are reviewed and scored. Mar. 22 – MIC Meeting: Reviews scoring and approves final rankings. Mar. 24 – MIC project list and rankings are submitted to the NE MN ATP.
Draft TIP March- June	Mar. 27 – MIC staff begin work on Draft 2018-2021 TIP. April 5 – NE MN ATP approved Draft list of projects. June 20/21 – TAC and MIC approve Draft TIP and release for public comment. June 22 - July 22 – Public comment period.
Final TIP July - September	July - Minor project changes and public comments are incorporated into Draft. August 15/16 – Final TIP is presented for Approval to TAC and MIC. August 18 – Distribution to MN/DOT & FHWA for their review and approval. August – FHWA & MN/DOT review process. September – Approval from FHWA. Final TIP is distributed to the public.

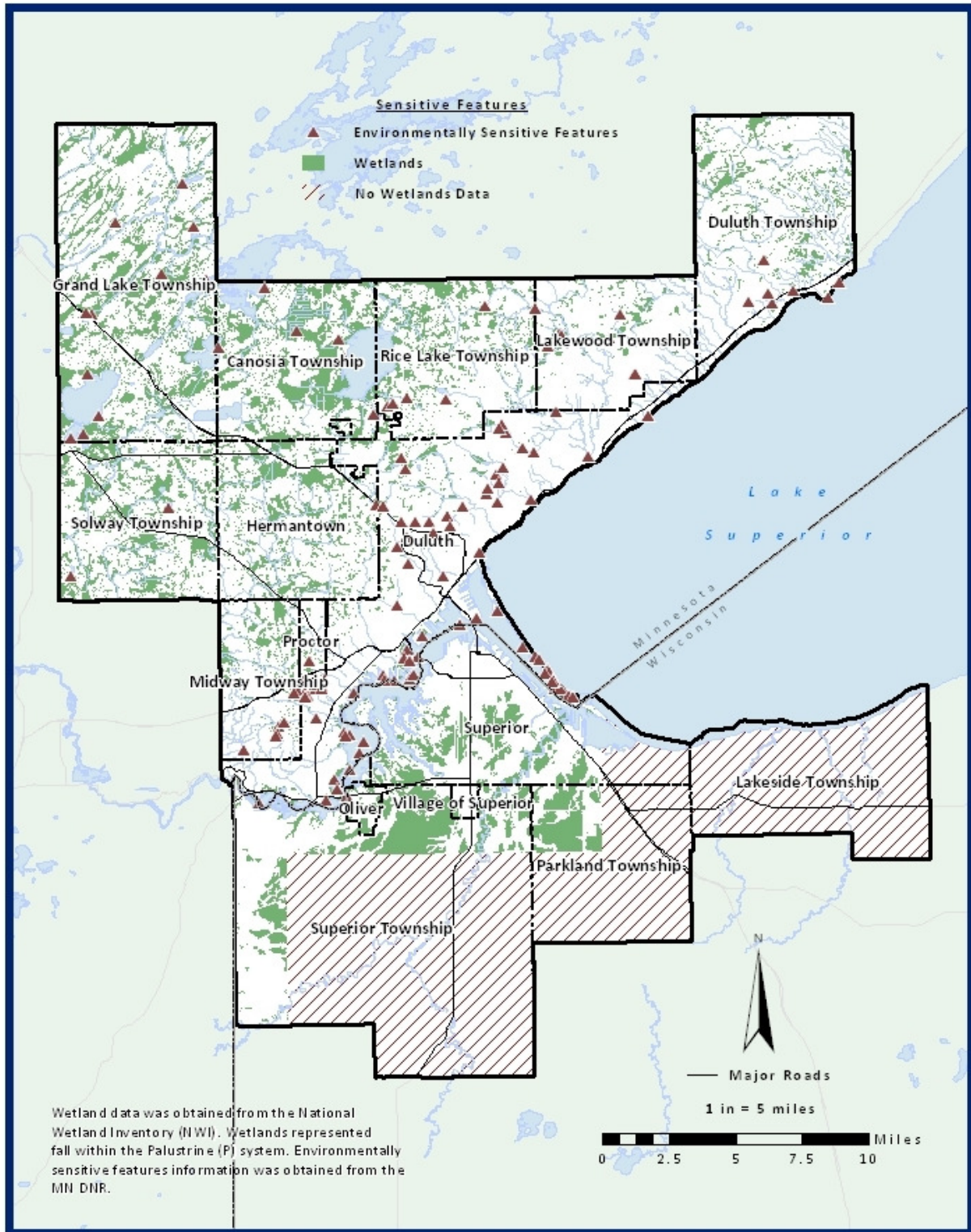
