4. DULUTH AREA TIP PROJECT SELECTION PROCESS

The MIC's Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Sustainable Choices 2045 that was approved last October is providing a more specific direction for transportation planning in the region. As a significant step towards implementing the LRTP the LRTP Implementation Team has been working on revising the TIP Process to better align it with meeting the LRTP's goals and objectives and provide additional information necessary for adequate reporting on the progress towards meeting the goals and objectives of the LRTP and the required performance measure targets. The LRTP Implementation Team and MIC staff have produced a set of draft documents that will be discussed during this TAC meeting and an overview will be shared with the MIC Policy Board this month prior to being finalized and brought before the MIC Policy Board next month.

Updated draft documents will be provided.

5. DULUTH-SUPERIOR METRO AREA PEDESTRIAN PLAN UPDATE

An overview of the Pedestrian Plan survey will be provided. The survey received a great response, with over 600 surveys completed. Key findings include filling sidewalk gaps and keeping sidewalk clear of obstructions and snow. A discussion on solutions and recommendations will take place.

6. HARBOR PLANNING

The Harbor Technical Advisory Committee (HTAC) met on September 2, 2020. This was the first time the quarterly HTAC meeting has been held virtually. Having cancelled the June meeting, this meeting was well attended, with approximately 67 people logged or called in. The agenda included the following:

- ***Safe Routes to School***

Walk to School/Anywhere Day is Wednesday October 7, 2020. While it is unknown at this time if students will be having in-person classes at this time, students are still being encouraged to get outside and walk anywhere on this date. Also, with student transportation looking different this school year, MnDOT released COVID 19 recommendations to maintain Safe Routes to Schools. When students return to in-person classes, it is anticipated that school congestion will increase due to more students being dropped off. This congestion can make it more challenging to walk and bike to school.
