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### 1. INTRODUCTIONS / AGENDA REVIEW

Nick Baker, WI Co-Chair called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm. He then asked for roll call attendance be taken.

### 2. COMMITTEE BUSINESS

- **Meeting Summary of 12.8.21**

Nick then asked if there were any questions or changes to the December meeting summary; hearing none he asked for a motion to approve.

<b>Motion Discussion and Vote</b>	Earl Elde/Warren Bender moved to approve the 12.8.21 meeting summary. There was no discussion; the motion was approved unanimously.
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- **MIC Director's Report**

Ron Chicka briefly reviewed the 2 items included in the meeting materials. WI highway 105 project between Tower Ave and the MN/WI state line tentatively set for 2025 and the Tower Ave Study the City is concluding (via AECOM) of a safety and operational plan for Tower between Belknap and 21<sup>st</sup> Street.

Mike Casey stated that they would like to wait to make comment until after the I-35 presentation.

### 3. 2022-2025 SUPERIOR AREA TIP AMENDMENT #1-3

In Sheldon Johnson's absence Ron Chicka described the 3 amendments being proposing to the 2022-2025 Superior Area TIP.

Amendment #1 and 2 are for the voucher program and a mobility manager for the North Country Independent Living Center. Amendment #3 covers the replacement of a side-load minivan for Senior Connections. The details can be found at the end of this summary.

<b>Motion Discussion and Vote</b>	Sam Pomush/Warren Bender moved to approve Amendments #1-3 to the 2022-2025 Superior Area TIP. A roll call vote was taken. There was no discussion; the motion was approved unanimously.
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### 4. CENTRAL ENTRANCE VISION PLAN

Ron Chicka provided a brief overview of what the plan covers. This plan is just the start of the upcoming reconstruction set for 2026 of Central Entrance. There will be much consideration of the concepts presented in this plan. There will be many public/steering committee meetings looking for input on these concepts. *Broc Allen asked if there were any 4 lane portions.*

*Ron addressed both questions with the fact that this is a vision document with several options being considered for each of the 5 sections. Many things will be considered by the consultant and a steering committee working towards a design.*

*Skip Williams stated that he was impressed with the MIC and this plan will provide conversations in the future. This is not a design plan.*

<b>Motion Discussion and Vote</b>	Warren Bender/Adam Fulton moved to approval the Central Entrance Vision Plan. There was no further discussion; the motion was approved unanimously.
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### 5. 2022 MN PERFORMANCE MEASURE TARGETS

Rondi Watson briefly reviewed the targets that were set. The MIC has the option to either adopt the PM targets that MnDOT has adopted or develop and adopt our own. We have chosen to adopt the MnDOT targets since it is cost prohibitive to develop our own. Please see the table included in the meeting materials and found in the attachments at the end of this summary.

With no questions or discussion a motion was requested.

<b>Motion Discussion and Vote</b>	Warren Bender/Ed Anderson moved to adopt the MnDOT Safety performance measures. There was no discussion; the motion was approved unanimously.
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### 6. I-35 CORRIDOR VISION – SCOPE OF WORK

Ron Chicka and Bryan Anderson team up to discuss the primary elements to be studied in this plan as it moves to the Request For Proposals (RFP) stage. Key study objectives are to examine numerous operational needs of the facility for all users including current and future safety needs of the freight community. The MIC and MnDOT will keep in mind and consider the ideas put forward in the Duluth Waterfront Collective visioning work that would seek to potentially show an altered “footprint” of the Interstate that is more multimodal in function and allows a more fluid flow of people between the downtown area and Canal Park. The scope includes a communications/engagement component that will draw from many local interest groups to gather input on problems and solutions. Overall, we will seek to identify needs in the short term that makes the corridor viable and safe while also looking ahead to the future as to how the corridor may function better and more equitable for all.

There were numerous members of the public who all asked that the “parkway” concept/vision developed by the Duluth Waterfront Collective and presented by Jordan VanDerHagen at the September meetings and was approved by the Duluth City Council.



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As Ron and Bryan closed out their presentation they noted that there would be substantial steering committee participation which will include many local interest groups to address the problems as well as possible solutions as this study/project progresses.

**TIP Project Amendments**

**TIP AMENDMENT #1**

This project enables North Country Independent Living Center (NCIL) the ability to continue their transportation vouchers program to eligible clients throughout (eight county area including; Ashland, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas, Iron, Price, Sawyer, and Washburn) northern Wisconsin. The project provides individuals with disabilities and residents aged 55 and over who are experiencing a transportation barrier a means of traveling to work, school, shopping, and other events. The vouchers are used to reimburse friends, neighbors and other volunteers who use their own vehicle for transporting disabled individuals. Federal funds for this project are made available through the Section 5310 (Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities) Program administered by WisDOT. The project will span January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022.

#### Administrative Modifications #5 & 6

#### US 53/Hwy 194 Intersection Improvements and MN 194 Roundabout/Resurface (SP #6916-113N and #6932-14)

MnDOT requested changes to the cost of projects 6916-113N and 6932-14 and the addition of an associated project 069-613-044 to project 6932-14.

These projects are tied with the same letting. 6916-113N (NHPP funded) has a cost increase due to unforeseen contaminated material. The City of Hermantown added local funds. The HSIP part of project 6916-113 is unchanged. The required federal funds for the increase are coming from 6932-14 due to its updated final design estimate which has a lower cost. ### Administrative Modifications #7, 8 & 9
